Evelyn has been the Deputy Director of the APEC Business Advisory Council (ABAC) International Secretariat since January 2002. She is concurrently the Executive Director of the Philippine National Committee of the Pacific Economic Cooperation Council (PPECC). PECC serves as a regional forum for cooperation and policy coordination to promote economic development in the Asia-Pacific region.

Evelyn was formerly with the Philippines' Department of Trade and Industry. She was Chief of the Multilateral and Regional Arrangements Division of the Bureau of International Trade Relations, the Department's trade policy arm, and was directly involved in the formulation of trade policies and negotiating positions relating to Philippine participation in regional and multilateral fora such as APEC, ASEAN, WTO and UNCTAD. She was involved in advocacy work for the ratification of the WTO Agreement by the Philippine Senate as well as in the preparation of technical inputs necessary for the negotiation of the ASEAN Free Trade Area (AFTA). Her involvement in the APEC process began in 1996 when the Philippines chaired APEC. She was representative to the APEC Committee on Trade and Investment, APEC Market Access Group and APEC Electronic Commerce Steering Group. She was also the overall coordinator for the Philippines' APEC Individual Action Plan.

Evelyn earned a Bachelor of Science in Business Economics (*Cum Laude*) degree from the University of the Philippines. She holds a Graduate Diploma and Master of Economics of Development degree from the Australian National University in Canberra, Australia. She has also attended various seminars and trainings in the field of trade policy, including the WTO Trade Policy Course in Geneva, Switzerland.
