



Zhang Shaogang is Vice Chairman of China Council for the Promotion of International Trade.

Prior to his current position, Mr. Zhang was the Director General of the Department of International Trade and Economic Affairs of China's Ministry of Commerce, from December 2013 to April 2020, responsible for the UN and bilateral development cooperation, China's FTA negotiations, and multilateral and regional economic affairs including G20, BRICS, APEC and ASEM, etc. He also served as Minister Counselor for economic and commercial affairs at the Chinese Embassy in the United States from January 2010 to September 2013, and Minister Counselor at the Permanent Mission of China to the United Nations from October 2008 to December 2009.

He was previously the Assistant Trade Negotiator of the Ministry of Commerce, leading the negotiations in establishing the Free Trade Areas between China and ASEAN, New Zealand, Singapore and Iceland. At the same time, he served as the Senior Economic Official of China for APEC trade and economic affairs.
