



David Frederick is recognized as one of the most creative and successful lawyers in the United States. He has argued landmark cases in the Supreme Court and U.S. Courts of Appeals that have shaped competition law, pharmaceutical safety and agricultural chemical regulation, transportation, the financial sector, water rights, and the environment. He also has represented individual States, British Columbia (Canada), and the European Union in significant appeals in the Supreme Court.

A former law clerk to Justice Byron White and Judge Joseph Sneed, he graduated from the University of Texas School of Law (J.D., with honors); the University of Oxford (D.Phil.), where he was a Rhodes Scholar; and the University of Pittsburgh (B.A., summa cum laude), where he was a Truman Scholar. He served in the Department of Justice as Assistant to the Solicitor General (1996-2001) and as Counselor to the Inspector General (1995-1996).

Mr. Frederick is the author of three books: *Supreme Court and Appellate Advocacy* (Thomson 4th ed. 2025, with a foreword by Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg); *The Art of Oral Advocacy* (West 3d ed. 2019); and *Rugged Justice: The Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals and the American West, 1891-1941* (UC Berkeley 1994, with a foreword by Justice Sandra Day O'Connor). Since 2001, David has been a partner at Kellogg, Hansen, Todd, Figel & Frederick, P.L.L.C. in Washington, D.C.
