

Azman Hashim is Chairman of the AmBank Group, the Asian Institute of Chartered Bankers, Asian Banking School Sdn. He was the Executive Chairman of Kwong Yik Bank Berhad, a subsidiary of Maybank from 1980 until April 1982 when he acquired AmInvestment Bank Berhad. Tan Sri Azman was conferred *The Order of Australia* (AO) and *The Order of The Rising Sun, Gold Rays with Neck Ribbon* by the Emperor of Japan.
