The Forum is a series of dialogues to promote public-private sector collaboration in developing local currency bond markets, with a broader focus in 2010 on innovative approaches to promote capital market development and integration." The Advisory Group has been requested to develop the program and coordinate the participation of key experts from the public and private sectors, including relevant international and regional organizations.
